

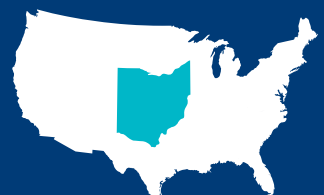

Beaumont School is an all-girls' Catholic high school in the Ursuline tradition that educates women for life, leadership and service.

Founded in 1850 by Ursuline Sisters of Cleveland, Beaumont is the oldest school in the Cleveland Diocese and the oldest all-girls' high school in Greater Cleveland.

Sponsored by the Ursuline Sisters of Cleveland and in collaboration with its lay educators, Beaumont is dedicated to its Catholic all-girls' college preparatory, liberal arts education in a multi-cultural setting. Our students experience intellectual, spiritual, and social growth while in and out of the classroom. A Beaumont student is confident, empowered, and strong. She has a voice; she is a self-advocate. She is a critical thinker who leads with compassion and contributes to her community. A Beaumont student embraces the world around her.

WHAT IS THE INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE DIPLOMA PROGRAMME?

At the heart of Beaumont School's academic program is an exceptional college preparatory curriculum that welcomes critical thinking, curiosity and collaboration. As the only all-girls' school in Northeast Ohio to offer the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme, students can take IB classes or fully participate in the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme, a gold standard for academic rigor and college preparation throughout the world.

WHY SHOULD MY DAUGHTER ENROLL IN THE IB DIPLOMA PROGRAMME?

Students activate a strong work ethic and are encouraged to own their learning process. They are asked to use their curiosity to fearlessly tackle the rigor of the curriculum. The results? Students experience an integrated approach to education, preparing them for higher education and the world beyond Beaumont.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE DIPLOMA PROGRAMME

The Diploma Programme (DP) organizes teaching and learning through six subject groups with various courses in each. (See dark blue box below.)

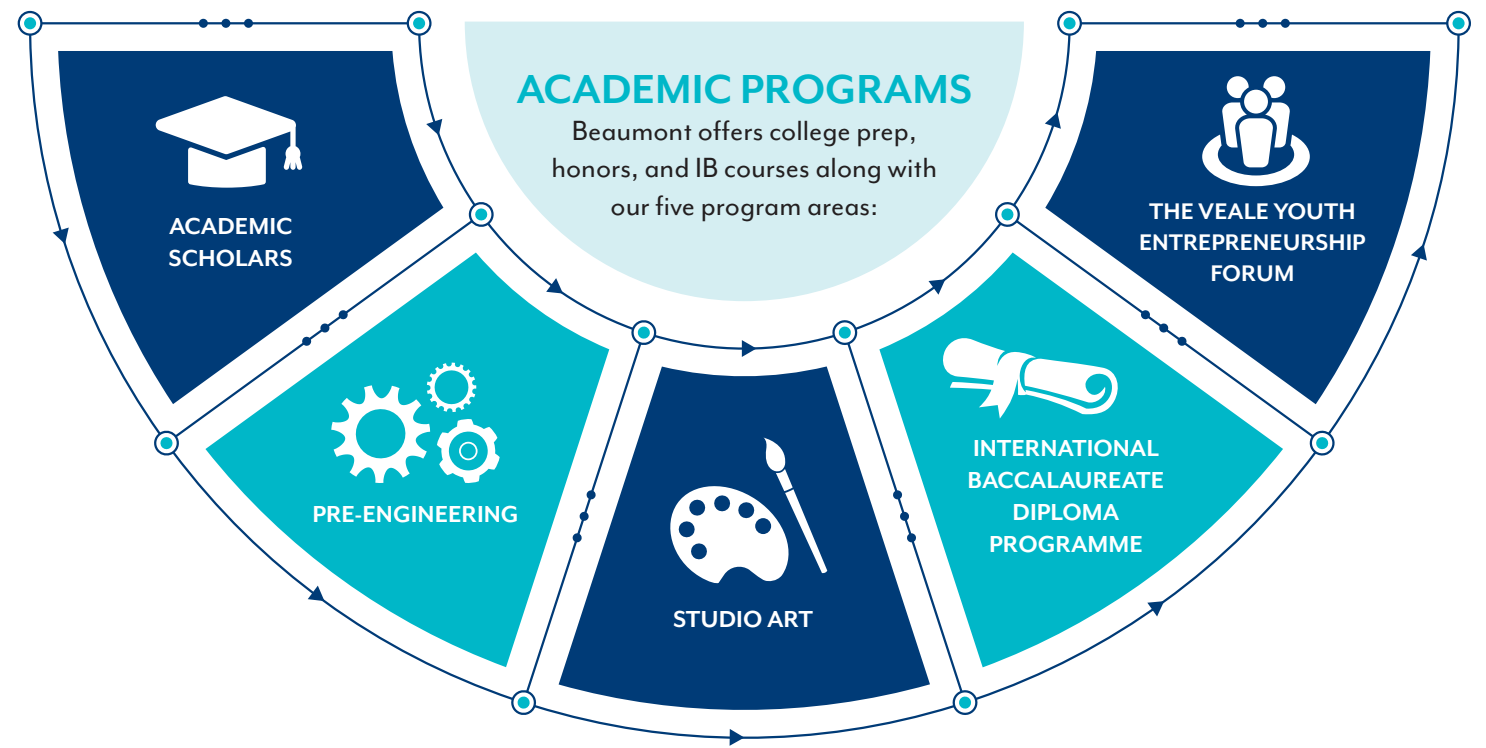
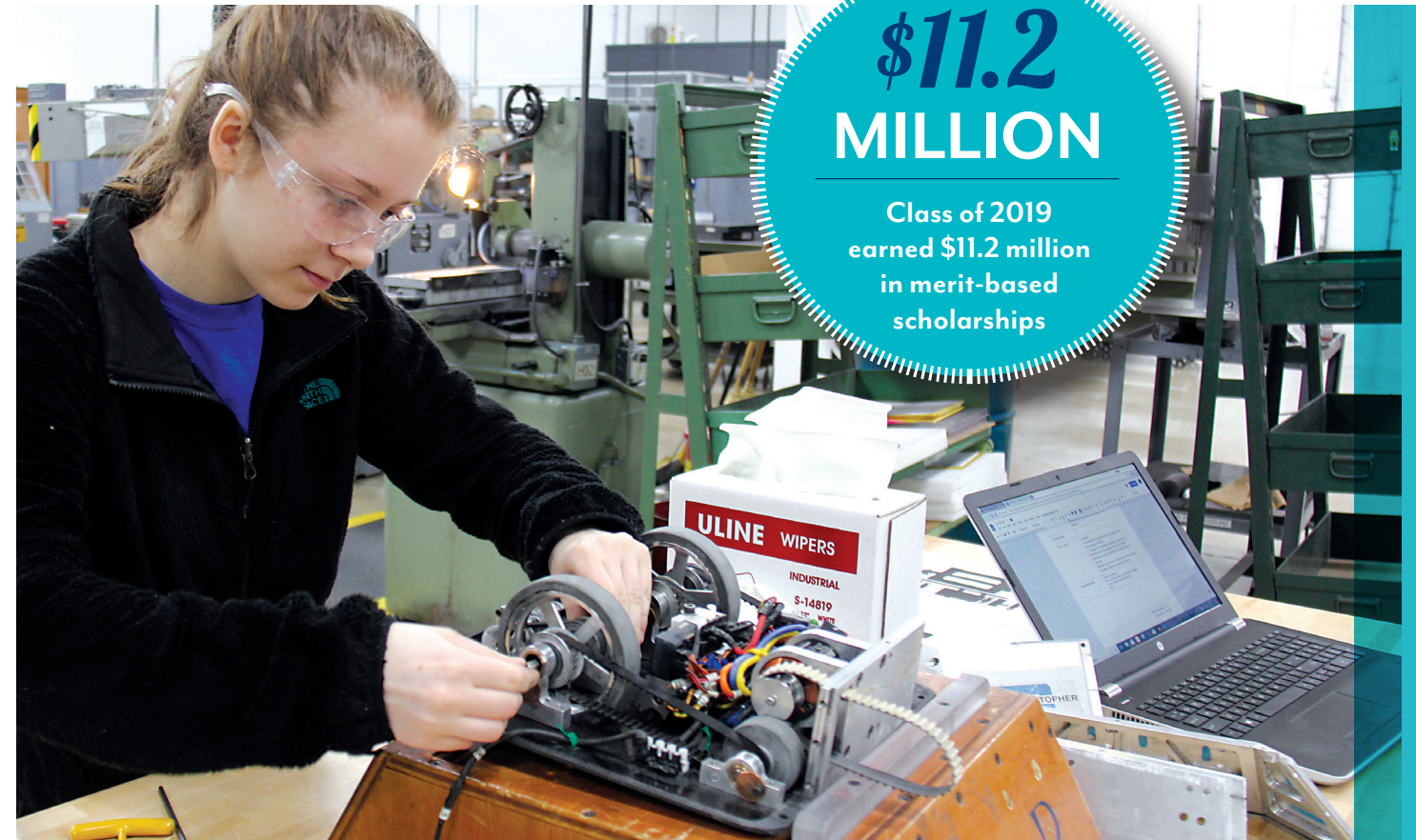
The program is underpinned by The Core:

- › **Theory of Knowledge (TOK)** is an interdisciplinary course designed to help students question and understand how they know what they know.
- › **Creativity-Activity-Service (CAS)** is the experiential learning component of IB. Students complete a wide variety of extracurricular, community service and athletic options to fulfill this requirement.
- › **The Extended Essay (EE)** introduces students to the demands and the rewards of independent work. Emphasis is placed on doing university-level research and communicating their ideas effectively in order to write a 4,000-word essay in an area of personal interest to them.
